The **SECOND COLLECTION** this weekend is for the Special Supplemental Offering for Parish Maintenance.

The **SECOND COLLECTION** next weekend will be for the Clergy Benefit Trust. There are 755 priests who rely on the Clergy Funds to provide for their healthcare. In addition, there are 275 senior priests who also rely on the Clergy Funds for their retirement benefits. In recent years, the Clergy Funds have been stressed with the increase in medical costs and expenses growing faster than income. The need to stabilize this fund is critical and a top priority of Cardinal Sean and all of the priests. The special collection to be taken is in addition to the Easter and Christmas collections, which are designated for the same purposes. Unfortunately, the shortfall of expenses versus income from these collections runs into millions of dollars each year which necessitates this additional collection for the Clergy Funds. We are thankful that you have chosen, in the past, to give generously to the priests who have devoted their lives to serve God and God's people. On behalf of all the priests, thank you in advance for your continued support.

Father's Day Remembrance envelopes may be dropped in the collection baskets at any time. Please specify "living" or "deceased". Special Masses will be offered during the month of June.

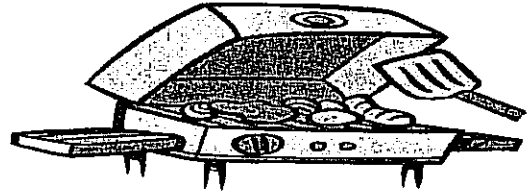

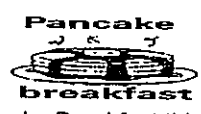

From the Pastor's Desk



After the glories of Easter and Pentecost, the Church leads us back into Ordinary Time by gentle degrees. Before our Sundays return to green, we celebrate two wonderful solemnities—the Most Holy Trinity and the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. The timing is still significant. At Pentecost, the Holy Spirit came in transforming power upon the disciples, and the life of faith that we know began: Jesus is no longer visible to our eyes, but he is present among us in wonderful ways through the power of the Holy Spirit. Today's solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity is ancient. The origins of the solemnity can be traced to the seventh century. It has been on the Church's universal calendar for nearly seven hundred years. "The central mystery of Christian faith and life" is the mystery of the Most Blessed Trinity. This solemnity offers us time to meditate upon this defining mystery of our faith.
